**Description of the specific emergency that necessitated the emergency procurement:**

A patient was life flighted to Utah Valley Medical Center (UVMC) due to critical harm resulting from an attempted suicide. Due to the extent of the injuries, medical providers had referred the patient to UVMC for ensuring the proper timeliness and access to care.

**Basis for the selection of the procurement item or service. What if any steps were taken to ensure that the procurement was made with as much competition as reasonably Practicable. (phone quotes, internet quotes):**

Due to the emergency healthcare needs, there was not enough time to obtain quotes. The patient was already on Life Flight prior to being able to be rerouted to UMC who is on contract. CHS anticipates to pay for the Life Flight costs, while the hospital costs should be charged through Medicaid since it was an inpatient admit. The price includes the estimated hospital costs in a circumstance that the patient is not Medicaid eligible. No quote has been received due it being a medical emergency. We have yet to obtain invoice and may take months to come.
